

  - Angels in the Architecture (2009) by Frank Ticheli
- Christian faith in tone poem on historical event
  - Mayflower Overture (1958, rev. 1997) by Ron Nelson
  - Ludlow: April 20th, 1914 (2014) by Roland Barrett [Colorado Coal Strike]
- Narrative embodying Christian concepts


### Six Emotional Arcs Andrew J. Reagan (2017)

Name	Contour	Overall
Rags to Riches	rise	Positive
Tragedy (or Riches to Rags)	fall	Negative
Man in a Hole	fall-rise	Positive
Icarus	rise-fall	Negative
Cinderella	rise-fall-rise	Positive
Oedipus	fall-rise-fall	Negative

Valence + Energy = Affect

Affect	Valence	Energy	Example Emotions
Highest	Positive	High	Happiness, Excitement
High	Positive	Low	Contentment, Tenderness
Low	Negative	Low	Sadness, Apathy
Lowest	Negative	High	Anger, Fear

- Arch Form
- A: church bells, fanfare
- B: Americana style
- C: Lyrical
- D: "Old Hundredth"

#### On the Third Day Patrick Roszell Section A1

- Motive X in melody and harmony
- Ostinato (evokes church bells)

• Fanfare



#### On the Third Day Patrick Roszell Section D

- "Conflict and Resolution"
- Timpani: heartbeat  $\rightarrow$  private
- Horns: "Old Hundredth" → faith, memory
- Trombone: mixture  $\rightarrow$  doubt
- Woodwinds: peace



#### On the Third Day Patrick Roszell **Climax**

• Layering of previous elements from Sections A1, B1, B2, and C


#### On the Third Day: A Celebration of Life Patrick Roszell

- Arc: Man in a Hole
- Musical Conflicts: "Old Hundredth" triumphs over dissenting trombone. Joyous outer sections triumph over reflective middle.
- Associations: Faith triumphs over doubt.

Joy triumphs over trials.

• Scope: an episode within a Christian's life


### *Fantasy on Old Hundred* by David R. Holsinger: **Form and Narrative**



- "Rags to riches"  $\rightarrow$  conversion
- Hymn grows increasingly prominent
- A1: motives
- A2: adds tune phrases
- A3: complete tune in minor
- B1: slow, soft chords
- B2: adds inverted melody
- A4: complete tune in major


*Fantasy on Old Hundred* David R. Holsinger **Section A2** 

- Isolated phrases of "Old Hundredth"
- Unstable
- Bitonality
- Key changes
- Meter changes



*Fantasy on Old Hundred* David R. Holsinger **Section B2** 

- Slower and softer
- Transposition, inversion, meter changes
- Understanding



*Fantasy on Old Hundred* David R. Holsinger **Section A4** 

- Starts in minor like A1
- Major marks shift from doubt to faith
- Embellished full statement of "Old Hundredth" in F major


### Fantasy on Old Hundred by David R. Holsinger

- Arc: Rags to riches
- Musical Conflicts: Complete "Old Hundredth" triumphs over fragments Major triumphs over minor
- Associations: Salvation triumphs over sin

Light triumphs over dark

Scope: Conversion: non-Christian becomes Christian

### Variations on a Hymn by Louis Bourgeois by Claude T. Smith: Form and Narrative



- Eternal praise
- Framed by intro, interlude, and coda with similar material
- 3 waves in affect
- 2 large groups of variations separated by interlude

• Variations of variations


#### Variations on a Hymn Claude T. Smith Framing

- Shared material in intro, interlude, & coda
- Praise in past, present, and future



#### Variations on a Hymn Claude T. Smith Variation 6-7

- Both contain complete "Old Hundredth" tune
- Variation 6
  - Tonic key
  - Diminution
- Variation 7
  - Dominant key
  - Descant pedal



#### Variations on a Hymn Claude T. Smith Variation 4

- 3 versions (like Var 1)
- Adds layers
- Last version adds final complete statement of "Old Hundredth"

#### Variations on a Hymn by Louis Bourgeois Claude T. Smith

- Musical Conflicts: "Old Hundredth" regains complete statement in tonic Major triumphs over minor Fast tempos eclipse slow
- Associations: Endless varied praise in past, present, and future
  - Scope: Praising God throughout eternity

  - "man in a hole": one trial within a Christian's life
- Fantasy on Old Hundred (2018) by David R. Holsinger
  - "rags to riches": Christian conversion, lost  $\rightarrow$  saved
- Variations on a Hymn by Louis Bourgeois (1984) by Claude T. Smith
  - praising God throughout eternity
